

# From the President

Ladies and Gentlemen:



The Convention will be from July 26 to July 29, 2022 and it will be held in San Antonio and Panna Maria, Texas. Please review this newsletter for more detail of the events.

We will celebrate the ACPC's seventy-fourth anniversary of our founding with events in San Antonio and we will visit the new fourteen million dollar Polish Heritage Center at Panna Maria. This Center presents, in a state-of-the-art facility, Polish Catholic history and tells the story of how Polish settlers arrived in Panna Maria, Texas in 1854 and established THE OLDEST PERMANENT POLISH SETTLEMENT IN THE UNITED STATES.

Those of us from the Eastern United States know of the Polish craftsmen who arrived in 1608 at the Virginia Jamestown Colony. They established profitable industries and won the right to vote by causing America's First Civil Rights Action for the Right To Vote in 1619. When the king revoked the Jamestown charter most of the Polish Craftsmen gradually returned to Europe. Although the Panna Maria settlement began over two hundred years later, persons of Polish descent have lived in the settlement since its beginning thus providing Panna Maria the title of THE OLDEST PERMANENT POLISH SETTLEMENT IN THE UNITED STATES.

Today we honor those Poles from Upper Silesia, in what was then the Kingdom of Prussia, who traveled to Panna Maria Texas. In Prussia, German language, culture, and the Protestant religion maintained a place of privilege. At the same time, most Catholics were ethnic Poles, who were marginalized and from isolated by their native language and culture.

We also acknowledge the extraordinary generosity of the people of Poland, which is recognized worldwide, as they help the people of Ukraine who escaped, like the Panna Maria Poles, from potential repression of the invading forces. Once again Poles embody the slogan and are assisting other nation's freedom struggles in addition to fighting for Polish causes – FOR YOUR FREEDOM AND OURS.

We hope you enjoy this newsletter and we hope to see you in Texas.

The ACPC will be holding its 74th Annual Convention in San Antonio, Texas on July 26-29. Opened in 1909, the St. Anthony is a Marriott Luxury Collection Hotel, has been designated as a national historic site. 

### Witamy Was! We welcome you to Panna Maria!

It was a perilous journey for the approximate 100 Polish families who came to the south Texas plains in 1854-1856, an inhospitable environment dramatically different from their native Upper Silesia. They came at the invitation of Fr. Leopold Moczygemba and established the first and oldest permanent Polish community in America, naming it Panna Maria.

The Polish Heritage Center, a jewel in Polonia's crown, which joyfully opened in October 2021, is intended to honor them and is for the benefit and enjoyment of all Americans of Polish descent and our brethren in Poland. Panna Maria is truly our very own "Plymouth Rock," a national monument envisioned to instill pride in our Polish heritage by sharing the traditions, trials and tribulations of those early settlers. The Center's founder, retired Bishop John W. Yanta, a great-grandson of the initial immigrants says: "We have to preserve our inherited values, we must share them with new generations of our families and with pride and thanksgiving share them with the whole world." Polish Nobel laureate Czesław Miłosz says it best, "The living owe it to those who no longer can speak to tell their story for them."

Not only is the Center itself inspirational, but it sits opposite Immaculate Conception parish, the oldest Polish Catholic church in the United States, the scene of countless sacramental celebrations since 1855. Adjacent to the church is St. Joseph School, the oldest Polish Catholic school in America, which now houses the Panna Maria Historical Society Museum where artifacts used by those early farming and ranching families are on display.

Together, it is easy to characterize Panna Maria as holy ground of American Polonia history.

San Antonio's famous Riverwalk

The Alamo



**M**uch of the city's unforgettable landscape has grown along the banks of the River Walk where stone paths run aside the San Antonio River connecting hotels, restaurants, and shops in the downtown core. The 15-mile River Walk also links Spanish Colonial Missions (a World Heritage Site, along with the Alamo), museums, public art and the Pearl, a former brewery reborn into an eclectic mix of shops, restaurants and entertainment.

San Antonio has five 18th century missions (Alamo, Concepciòn, San José, San Juan, Espada). The Alamo is famous for its pivotal battle site. Concepciòn is arguably the best-preserved Spanish Colonial structure in the United States. San Jose is a lavish example of Spanish ornamentation. San Juan was a renowned farming location. Espada features a blacksmith shop, working kiln, spinning wheel and colonial irrigation system to reveal early Spanish colonial agrarian life.

San Antonio museums include Brisco Western Art Museum for cowboy arts. McNay Museum contains modernist art. San Antonio Museum of the Arts boasts extensive artwork from Asia and Latin America. The US Army Medical Museum educates visitors on the evolution of battlefield medicine, medical equipment and patient treatment since 1776. And there are many more museums, theatre and exhibits to explore. Extend your stay beyond the Convention days to explore San Antonio!

### The Sembrich Award Concert - Wednesday, July 27, 2022

The ACPC Sembrich Award was established in 1971 to support the career development of a young singer of Polish descent. It honors Marcella Kochańska Sembrich (1858-1935) a Polish born coloratura soprano with a long career at the Metropolitan Opera, after which she taught at the Curtis Institute and the Juilliard School of Music. Each year, the ACPC Music Committee conducts a nationwide competition in which it selects one winner with the participation of a panel of distinguished judges from the world of music. The winner of this year's competition will be announced in June and will appear in concert during the ACPC Convention in San Antonio, Texas, on Wednesday, July 27.

### Awards Banquet - Friday, July 29, 2022

Black ties may no longer be required but gentlemen do put on their best suits and you can spot a long gown here and there among the fancy dresses worn by the ladies. From an elegant room setting to dressy attire and lively entertainment, the ACPC Awards Banquet has all the signs of a celebration. #### Siege of Savannah Commemoration

- The ACPC annually participates in the re-enactment on the Battlefield where Brigadier General Kazimierz Pułaski was mortally wounded on October 9, 1779, and is now engaged in dedicating stone tablets on the Battlefield to commemorate all those who fought there.

#### • Poles in Jamestown Project

- The ACPC continues to advocate for the recognition of the Polish contributions to the Jamestown settlement in colonial Virginia. We dedicated an Historical Marker in Jamestown Virginia to commemorate the arrival of the first Poles there in 1608 and the first industry in the New World—glassmaking. We continue to promote the historic accomplishment of the first successful work stoppage in the New World in 1619 led by the Poles for the right to vote.
